About ABC/25 Foundation

The ABC/25 Foundation is a non-for-profit organization that began in 1991 by a group of caring parents to give **A B**etter **C**ommunity for District **25**, hence the name ABC/25 Foundation. The mission of the Foundation is "*To foster Innovation, Creativity and Excellence for the children of District 25.*" The foundation's Board of Directors is comprised of district parents, local community leaders, and school administrators that volunteer their time to serve the students of District 25.

Since its inception, ABC/25 Foundation has raised and contributed more than <u>\$1 million</u> to fund numerous projects and grants for District 25 students and teachers. The ABC/25 Foundation directly impacts the educational environment to better prepare our children for the future.

Fundraising

In the 2016-2017 school year, the Foundation raised money through four key fund-raisers: Membership Drive, Product Sales (i.e. Yankee Candle), In-School Draw-ings, and the Just Move it! Challenge. The In-School Drawings and Just Move it! Challenge are conducted in partnership with PTA Council* and proceeds are di-vided equally between the two organizations. *Proceeds from both fundraisers are held in the Scholarship and Grant Fund account



Grants Funded

The Foundation supports four different grants that benefit District 25 schools:



<u>Membership School Incentive Grant</u> - Each year, the ABC/25 Foundation grants **\$2,500** to all District 25 schools when 25% of the school's families become members. One membership is counted towards all district schools children in one family attend. The grant funds may be used at the school's discretion.

<u>Karen Wessel Barr Traditional Teacher Grants (KWB Teacher Grants) –</u> Each year, teachers and district staff submit over 50 grant applications. The applications are reviewed and awarded by voting members of the Board of Directors.

<u>District-wide Grant</u> (previously All School Large Grant) – Typically this grant is used to fund large-scale initiatives across District 25.

<u>Marian Elliott Excellence in Education Teacher Grants – This grant is funded by a generous endowment from former District 25 teacher Marian Elliott. Ms. Elliott's intent for the use of the funds was "to support teacher grants for enhancing student learning experiences." This grant differs from the KWB Teacher Grants in that the proposals are larger in scale.</u>

ABC/25 has funded numerous projects and/or grants for the children of District 25 including:

- iPads, iPods, eBook Readers, ChromeBooks, and supporting apps
- 88 digital microscopes for the elementary science curriculum
- Outdoor collaborative student learning spaces
- State of the art workout facilities at the middle schools
- Curtains and lighting improvements for Drama/Fine Arts programs or departments
- Traverse Climbing Walls at each elementary school
- Annual colonial historical re-enactments for all 5th grade students (\$2,000 annually)
- Administrative structure and \$20,000 for the Matthew Ives Memorial Track at South Middle School.

These creative and innovative programs and projects would not be available under current School District budget constraints.
